For fome days bye-paft, there have beni feveral affrays between the inhabitants, and the foldiers quartered in this town. LaitMonday about 90 eilocks at night a most unfortunate affair happened in King-firest ribe ceaning lopited at the Cuttom-houle, being furrounded by a number of people, called to the main-guard, upon which Capt. Pretion, who was Captain of the day, with a party wort to his affiliance; foou after which from of the party fired, by which the following persons were killed and wounded.

Mr. Samuel Gray, ropemaker, killed.—M. Millatto man named, Johnfon, killed.—Mr.

James Caldwell, mate of Capt. Morton's vellel,

killed .- Mr. Samuel Maverick, wounded, and fince dead .- A Lad named Christopher Monk, wounded .- A lad named John Clark, wounded. -Mr. Edward Payne, Merchant, ftanding at his entry-door, wounded in the arm .- Mr. John Greene, taylor, wounded .- Mr. Patrick Cole, wounded .- David Parker, wounded. Early next morning Captain Preston was committed to goal, and fame day 8 foldiers. A meeting of the inhabitants was called at Fanueil-hall that forenoon ; and the Lieutenant-Governor and Council, met at the Council-chamber, where the Colonels Dalrymple and Carr were defired to attend, when it was concluded upon, that both regiments should go down to the barracks at Castle-William, as

foun as they were ready to receive them.

actions of this unhappy affair, as we bear the trial
of the unfartunate prefeners is to come on next week.
