Early American Newspapers has been created through partnerships with the American Antiquarian Society, the Library of Congress, the Wisconsin Historical Society and more than 90 other institutions. A distinguished academic advisory board supervises the title selection process, considering the historical significance of each newspaper and the diverse political positions of the period. Bibliographic control is provided by Clarence S. Brigham's "History and Bibliography of American Newspapers, 1690-1820," Winifred Gregory's "American Newspapers, 1821-1936," and records from the Library of Congress.
