A Law to amend the Law, entitled a Law to regulate Hackney Coaches and Carriages,

Passed, Feb. 13, 1826.

BE it Ordained by the Mayor, Aldermen and Commonalty of the city of New York, in Common Council convened, That every licensed Hackney Coach, Carriage and Sleigh, when used or driven in the night, shall have fixed up on some conspicuous part on the outside thereof, a lighted Lamp with glass front and sides, and the Licensed number thereof placed on the front and sides of such lamp, in plain legible figures of at least two inches in length, with no other figure or device thereon, so that the same may be distinctly seen. And if any person or persons shall drive or use any such Hackney Coach, Carriage, or Sleigh at night and shall neglect to have such lamp fixed up, lighted and numbered as aforesaid, he shall forfeit and pay for every such neglect the sum of twenty-five dollars, to be recovered of the owner or driver thereof. NAVY COMMISSIONERS' OFFICE,

11th February, 1826.

THE Commissioners of the Navy will receive sealed proposals until the 15th day of March, for the supply of all the Round, Square and Flat American IRON, that may be required for the use of the Navy during the present year—to be delivered at
