Ecker Tells N. Y. Legislators He Opposes Stipulation as to Earnings and Arrears of Unsecured Securities

New York, Dec. 7 (AP)—E. W. Ecker, vice-president of the Metropolitan Life Insurance company, voiced objection today to a proposed New York state insurance code...

Appearing before the joint legislative committee on revision of the insurance law, he specifically opposed a provision which would require that an unsecured obligation, to become eligible as a life insurance company investment, must have earned interest for five consecutive years.

The provision, formerly in the code, was eliminated by the Legislature.

Ecker also took exception to a proposal to bar securities on which there were dividend arrears.

Read What's Happening in Brain of Man in a Soundproof Room

Rochester, N. Y., Dec. 7 (AP)—At the University of Rochester, psychologists are reading on a strip of paper symbols that tell them what is happening in the brain of a man in a soundproof room.

The subject lies on a couch with electrodes attached to his head. He remains still and whether he is actually asleep or thinking makes no difference, for his brain is working nevertheless.

Psychologists are working on the theory that the brain is continually emitting electrical impulses in wave-like formation that can be picked up by electrodes, amplified and transcribed on a moving strip of tape.
