Man, 22, is slain in burglary attempt

A 22-year-old Richmond County resident was shot and killed early yesterday morning as he reportedly attempted to break into the Carter Borrell Hagler Post No. 178 of the American Legion. Sheriff's deputies said Charles Ray Lampley of 2248 Wheelock Rd. died instantly after receiving a 12-gauge shotgun blast in the head about 1:30 a.m. The body was found by Allen L. Smith, 31, of 2222 Neal St. who, with John B. Baxter, 33, of 2144 East Side Court, was on guard against a possible burglary. "Justifiable Homicide" Smith, given a preliminary hearing by Municipal Court Judge L. W. Cooper, was found to have committed an act of "justifiable homicide." He was freed. Criminal Investigator Holley T. Sullivan said the Legion hall had been visited by thieves during the night several times lately and Smith and Baxter had been stationed inside to discourage further attempts. Lampley had been discovered, Sullivan said, at a window as he tried to gain entrance. Smith called on him to stand fast. Sullivan said, then fired at him. Sheriff James T. Plunkett last night called on others who might be employed to break up burglaries to "exercise extreme caution." "It is true," he said, "that the law gives a man the right to protect his property - by force of arms if necessary. However, shooting an intruder should probably be the last resort. Every effort should be made to hold him for the deputies which should be possible in most cases." The sheriff added: "Of course, this is Monday morning quarterback thinking now. None of us know what we would do in similar circumstances until we find ourselves in it."

Funeral services for Lampley will be held at the Oak Grove Baptist Church at 3 p.m. today.
