Spanning 1869 to 1993, this unique digital archive is a high-interest resource for students of twentieth-century American and global history. It supports research in Jewish studies, American studies, immigration studies, international and European studies, sociology, cultural studies, psychology, and other disciplines. Comprised of periodicals, pamphlets, books, organizational records, press clippings, illustrations, and ephemera, the collection reveals the rhetoric, ideologies, and networks that spread hostility toward Jews and other marginalized groups.

### **American Indian Wars, 1830-1898**

Unprecedented access to many of the U.S. Army's most vital 19th-century records, as curated by the National Archives (NARA). This resource illuminates the interactions between military forces and Native American tribes during the pivotal 19th century, offering critical perspectives for both research and instruction in Native American history.

### **Native American Documents: The Federal Record, 1789-1994**

Chronicling the turbulent history of Native Americans and the government of the United States across 200 years, this digital archive offers thousands of documents, dozens of suggested search paths, and text analysis tools that enable renewed insights for multidisciplinary research.

Researchers can now explore the foundational contributions of Africans in early American history with this fully searchable digitized resource, showcasing printed works from the 1500s to the 1770s.

Containing digitized printed works from the onset of the American Revolution to the Early Republic period, scholars can explore the pivotal role of African Americans in Revolutionary America and uncover their profound impact on early American history.

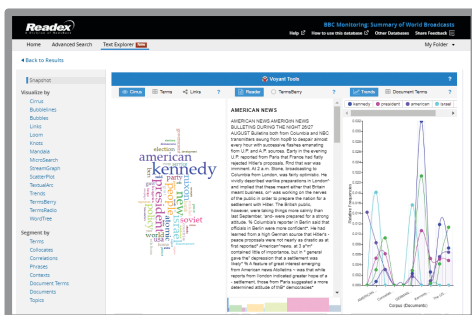

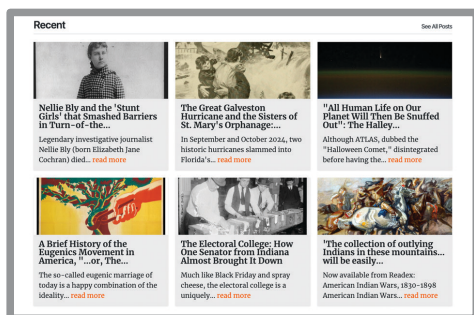
