Dr. C. C. Peters, assistant hospital physician, stated that the man was given first aid and denied that such a policy existed elsewhere in the hospital. However, Sister Superior stated that such a policy did exist and had for one year. When asked by a Plaidlander reporter what the circumstances would be if a Negro was shot or injured one block from the door of the new Douglas hospital, she stated that due to the hospital not having but 18 beds for colored, the patient would have to be taken elsewhere, where a hospital just can't handle those cases after 7 P. M.

Inquiry by this newspaper from Miss Francis Kilmer, Supt. of the New Douglas hospital in Quindlen, who is in charge of their policy was in regard to serving emergency patients. Miss Kilmer stated that the doors of the new Douglas hospital are open to all regardless of race and are open 24 hours.

Washington is employed at the Cudahy Packing Co., and has a hospitalization policy. St. Margaret's is listed as one of the institutions to administer to those holding such policies.
