SUFFRAGE AMENDMENT IS DECLARED FEDERAL CONSTITUTIONAL LAW

SECRETARY COLBY OF STATE DE-PARTMENT PUTS OFFICIAL AP-PROVAL ON RATIFICATION

INVITES SUFFRAGE LEADERS

Invitation Sent Out to Leaders in Suffrage Fight to Meet Colby, and to Hear His Statement, Could Not Be Accepted.

Washington, Aug. 26.—The proclamation announcing officially that the Federal sufrage amendment had been ratified was signed today by Secretary of State Coby. The document was signed at 8 o'clock this morning at Coby's home, when the Tennessen governor's certificate was received.

Colby Invites Suffrage Leaders
Washington, Aug. 28.—Secretary
Colby later sent word to women's
party headquarters that he would
see suffrage leaders at his office if
they desired. Word was sent back
that leaders had already returned to
their homes and the invitation could
not be accepted.

Secretary Colby had prepared as statement regarding ratification of the suffrage amendment which he intended to real to the national committee of the Woman's party. The women expressed keen disappointment with their inability to arrango a celebration of the ratification, and returned with plans to celebrate independently.

Another Party Arrives
When the invitation was declined,
another party appeared at the secretary's office. They were members of
the Woman's American Sufrage Association, headed by Mrs. Carry
Catt.
