## Soggy weather cuts recreation attendance

### Visitors increase at Wall Drug

Rain, fog and a threat of tornadoes plagued South Dakota dur-ing the Memorial Day weekend, limiting attendance at some recre ation spots, officials said Monday.

Meanwhile, at least one person died on the state's roads. A 29-year-old Sioux Falls man, Mark Prentice, died from injuries he received in an accident east of Sioux Falls Saturday night.

A park ranger at Lewis and Clark Lake Recreation Area said the area was 100 percent full Friday night,

but the weather chased people out by Sunday. Derrick Barr said attendance was down to 40 percent full Sunday.

Total attendance at the area's three camping units was 18,165 people, down from last year, Barr said. He could not estimate yet how much it was off.

Monday was rainy and foggy at Mount Rushmore National Memorial, said Steve Kveene, park ranger at the monument.

"It's a good day to go visit a cave when it's foggy," Kveene said. About 10,000 people visited Mount Rushmore Saturday and about 8,000 people both Sunday and Monday.

Kveene said visitation at the memorial normally does not pick up until mid-June, when about 18,000 people a day view the monument. Last year's Memorial Day weekend attendance was about 9,000 people the first day; 10,740 the second day and 7.750 the third day.

Attendance was up about 15 per cent this weekend at Wall Drug, said manager Rick Hustead.

"This has been a very dramatic Memorial Day weekend," Hustead said. "It was like our volume doubled going into the weekend.

"I think the weather had an impact, (but) people are also ready to travel. The season is off to a really good start.

Between 95,000 and 100,000 people attended Sunday's open house at Ellsworth Air Force Base, said Maj. Ron Trithart, Ellsworth's public affairs officer. The event featured aerial aircraft demonstrations and displays. Two thousand people attended an open house Saturday for senior citizens, handicapped people and their families, Thrithart said.

Kveene expects attendance to improve at Mount Rushmore. "We're expecting a pretty good year," he said. "The Fourth of July year," will be kind of a big one this year with the 50th anniversary of the Lincoln" sculpture and the 200th birthday of the U.S. Constitution, he

## Round Lake fish kill tied to water quality probe

BROOKINGS (AP) - A controlled fish kill in one of the Oakwood Lakes chain in Brookings County is part of a larger study aimed at reducing algae and improving water quality, South Dakota State

University reachers say. The officials say they hope the managed fish kill in Round Lake last week will yield information on how fish species affect water quali-

It was part of the \$340,000 Re-Oakwood Lakes System Study. Researchers wanted to get rid of minnows and rough fish in Round Lake and restock it with predatory game fish like northern pike. The goal: to find out if fish management can improve water quality

"Everything went on without any hitches," David German of the SDSU Water Resources Institute said the fish kill. "It was an ideal situation for what we wanted to

Dead fish started surfacing 30 minutes after the chemical Rotenone was poured into the lake water, and boats netted about 8,000

pounds of dead fish, German said.

Before the chemical was added, game fish were netted from Round Lake and released in nearby Lake Tetonkaha.

After the scientists are sure the chemical's effects have subsided; they will restock Round Lake with northern pike from Lake Sinai.
