

# BERLIN BARS BAREFOOT DANCE OF ISADORA DUNCAN.



Well-Known American Girl,  
a Favorite in German Em-  
peror's Capital, Prohibited  
From Performing Much  
Discussed Feature

NEW YORK, Jan. 6.—Dispatches from Berlin stating that Miss Isadora Duncan, the American dancer, who is in Germany, had been prohibited by the Berlin police from dancing barefooted in public, were received in New York with surprise and were freely discussed by theatrical and society people yesterday.

At the German Consulate here it was said yesterday that there was no law in Germany prohibiting Miss Duncan's performance, and that a similar case never had been heard of. Women in Germany, it is said, often appear in swimming costumes in public places which would cause their arrest at Atlantic City or Narragansett Pier.

The prohibition of the dance is nothing more than a police regulation, such as is often put into effect in New York when an objectionable act is put on the stage.
